

Personal injury compensation

If you or your horse has suffered an injury, no matter how trivial - due to a road traffic accident, attack by another horse or other negligence due to an act or omission by a third party - it is worth finding out from a solicitor if there is any possibility of claiming compensation. Put simply, if the injuries sustained were not entirely your own fault, then you are likely to be entitled to bring a claim. Most claims are met by some form of insurance, rather than being paid out by individuals themselves.

What can you claim?

In addition to claiming for the pain and suffering caused by the injury itself – whether it is bruising, cuts, broken bones, or something more serious – you may also be able to claim compensation for the way that the injury has affected your lifestyle, both now and in the future.

A typical claim if **you** are injured may include:

- never being able to ride again or for a significant period of time
- not being able to work with horses anymore
- loss of earnings
- damage to your property, tack or clothing
- the cost of medical treatment
- projected future losses
- pain and suffering
- travelling expenses

A typical claim if **your horse** is injured may include:

- diminution in value
- vets, farrier and dentistry bills
- added livery fees
